
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












WHAT WORKED WELL



Strong multi-agency partnerships (Adult Social Care, Project Pilot, Job Centre)



Simple & accessible referral process



Specialist support led to training & jobs



Welcoming, person-focused spaces helped participant engagement

WHAT WAS DIFFICULT



Staffing gaps affected consistency



Too much admin meant Navigators had less time to engage with participants



Taxi use limited opportunities to develop independent travel skills



Delays when families or support staff gave mixed messages/didn't engage
